## **Churches Together in Chellaston: Welcome and Farewell**

We welcome Rev Jacqueline Quarmby to Chellaston, Newmount and Findern. Rev Jacqueline replaces Rev Greg Obongoshotse who is moving to minister in London.

**CAFOD:** Thanks to your support, CAFOD has been helping communities around the world cope with the pandemic. In Zambia, over the past year, we've been able to reach over 1 million people with messages on COVID-19, provide over 13k people with access to safe water, train 392 frontline health workers from Zambia's 11 dioceses on how to prepare and respond to COVID-19 in their local communities AND donate over 1000 handwashing hygiene stations in communities to support handwashing measures.

Thank you for standing alongside people in Zambia and for supporting communities in more than 30 other countries worldwide.

**CAFOD Update:** To keep volunteers and supporters informed about CAFOD's ongoing work, there has been a series of webinars. Two recent talks have been recorded. Crisis, conflict and climate change in Ethiopia. Conor Molloy, the country representative, who visited Tigray in February, explains how the Catholic Church is providing emergency assistance in what is a very grave situation.

The other talk is about the work of Sadaka-Reut. Established in 1983. Its grassroots dialogue and leadership development programmes seek to address the deep-seated injustices caused by the Israeli-Palestinian conflict by educating and empowering Palestinian and Jewish youth in Israel to pursue social and political change through bi-national partnership.
