

Day of Prayer for Victims and Survivors of Abuse (DPSA), 4th May 2021

The Pontifical Commission for the Protection of Minors (PCPM) has highlighted the importance of prayer and suggested to Pope Francis that the worldwide Catholic Church should join together in a day of prayer. The Holy Father has welcomed this initiative. This is not a penitential day for the failure of the Church and others to respond to the scourge of abuse, but a day of prayer for those who have been abused, in a season of hope and new life. Bishop Patrick will be marking this day by offering a Holy Hour at the Cathedral from 12noon and then he will celebrate the 1pm Mass. Confessions will take place during the time of Holy Hour.

To all those who may be interested, a weekly Sunday Mass in the older form of the Mass (1962 Missal, aka. the Extraordinary form) is taking place at the parish church of St Joseph, off the Burton Road and near the city, every **Sunday morning at 8.00am**, moveable to 7.00am when the present restrictions begin to fall away.
