This year's 1st Holy Communion class - at 55 children, is the largest the parish has experienced since the 1960's. Alas, the pandemic chose the same year to raise its ugly head! Given the unlikely event of the government lifting the social distancing restrictions which have been imposed upon us in the short term, I am afraid there will be no 1st Holy Communion this year. This day for our children is such an important moment in their lives, and in the life of the parish – it must be celebrated worthily and fully; alas, this is not possible. Names will be carried over to next year when I hope to have the 1st Holy Communion (2020 class) in the first half of the year, and the class of 2021 in the second half.

Further, the 2020 Confirmation class will be merged with that of 2021; classes for this I intend to start running in the New Year after the first school half term holiday.
