St Martin of Tours, Bishop (Memorial) – 11 Nov:

St Martin (316-397) was born to pagan parents at Szombthely (now Hungary, but then in the Roman province of Pannonia) and served as a soldier. At the age of eighteen he was baptized and, around this time, a naked beggar to whom he gave half of his cloak. That night he had a dream in which the Lord Himself was wearing his cloak. St Martin founded a monastery and became Bishop of Tours (France). He was one of the first saints to be popularly venerated despite not being a martyr.

St Josaphat, Bishop & Martyr (Memorial) – 12 Nov:

St Josaphat (c.1580-1623) was born in Voladymyr-Volynskyi (Ukraine) of Orthodox parents, although he later became a Catholic and entered the Basilian Order at Vilnius. As Archbishop of Polotsk, he worked faithfully for the reform of the Church and unity between East and West. He faced much opposition and suffered martyrdom at the hands of an angry mob at Vitebsk (Belarus).

St Margaret – Secondary Patron of Scotland (Feast in Scotland) – 16 Nov:

St Margaret (1046-93) was the granddaughter of King Edmund Ironside of England but was born while in exile in Hungary. In 1070 she married King Malcolm III of Scotland and had eight children, three of whom reigned as Kings of Scotland, including St David I. Remarkable for her piety and works of charity, St Margaret co-founded Dunfermline Abbey and organized ferries at North and South Queensferry for pilgrims crossing the Firth of Forth on the way to St Andrews.

St Hugh of Lincoln, Bishop (Feast) – 16 Nov:

St Hugh (1140-12) was born in the Alpine village of Avalon, Imperial Burgundy, in what was then the Holy Roman Empire, and what is today southeastern France. Upon the death of Hugh's mother, his father sent him to the nearby community of Canons Regular of St. Augustine at Villarbenoît (sometimes Villard-Benoît) to receive a religious education. At the age of 15, Hugh made his profession as a Canon Regular (with the rank of novice). He was ordained a deacon at the age of 19. In 1163 he became a Carthusian Monk and later ordained a priest. In 1170 King Henry II requested he become prior of the first Carthusian Monastery in England. He was appointed Bishop of Lincoln in 1186.
