St John Paul II, Pope (Opt Mem) - 22 October:

Karol Józef Wojtyła was born in 1920 in Wadowice, Poland. After his ordination to the priesthood and theological studies in Rome, he returned to his homeland and resumed various pastoral and academic tasks. He became first auxiliary bishop and, in 1964, Archbishop of Kraków and took part in the Second Vatican Council. On 16 October 1978 he was elected pope and took the name John Paul II. His exceptional apostolic zeal, particularly for families, young people and the sick, led him to numerous pastoral visits throughout the world. Among the many fruits which he has left as a heritage to the Church are above all his rich Magisterium and the promulgation of the Catechism of the Catholic Church as well as the Code of Canon Law for the Latin Church and for the Eastern Churches. In Rome on 2 April 2005, the eve of the Second Sunday of Easter (or Divine Mercy), he departed peacefully in the Lord. He was canonized by Pope Francis on 27 April, the Second Sunday of Easter 2014.

St John of Capistrano, Priest (Opt Mem) - 23 October:

St John of Capistrano (1386-1456) was married in his youth but it was later annulled. He gave up a promising career in order to become a Franciscan and became a popular preacher in Italy and beyond, often being entrusted with papal missions. He preached a crusade after the Turks captured Constantinople in 1453 and exhorted the victorious Christian troops at the battle of Belgrade in 1456. He died shortly afterwards of the plague of llok (Croatia).

St Anthony Mary Claret, Bishop (Opt Mem) – 24 October:

St Anthony Mary Claret (1807-1870) was born near Barcelona (Spain). In 1849 he founded the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (Claretians) and was appointed Archbishop of Santiago (Cuba). He worked hard to spread the Gospel and ensure better conditions for slaves. Such was the anti-clerical mood that no less than fifteen attempts were made on his life. In 1857 he returned to Spain and acted as confessor to Queen Isabella II

Six Welsh Martyrs and their Companions (Feast) – 25 Oct:

The Feast commemorates six Welsh martyrs: St Richard Gwyn (c.1537-1584), St John Jones (c.1559-1598), St John Roberts (c.1575-1610), St Philip Evans 1645-1679), St John Lloyd (c.1630-1679) and St David Lewis (1616-1679). These stand as representatives of the many who suffered persecution during the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries, and risked their lives for love of the Church and the Holy Eucharist.

Ss Chad and Cedd, Bishops (Opt Mem) – 26 October:

These two brothers were monks of Lindisfarne who became bishops in the seventh century. St Cedd (+ 664) founded an abbey at Lastingham, North Yorkshire, and became bishop of the East Saxons. St Chad (+ 672) succeeded his brother as Abbot of Lastingham and became Archbishop of York. Although, due to a dispute, he was removed from office by St Theodore, he was allowed to continue his episcopate in the Midlands, fixing his residence at Lichfield. His relics are now preserved at St Chad's Cathedral, Birmingham.

Prayer to St Michael:
