St Andrew Düng-Ląc, Priest, & Companions, Martyrs (Memorial) – 24 November:

The feast celebrates the witness of 117 Vietnamese martyrs, who died between 1625 and 1886 and were canonised in 1988. The include St Andrew Dũng-Ląc (1795-1839), a Vietnamese diocesan priest who was beheaded at Hanoi in 1939. Twenty-one of the martyrs were foreign missionaries, such as St Théophane Vénard, a member of the Paris Society of the Foreign Missions, who was beheaded in 1861 and exercised a strong influence on St Thérése of Lisieux.

St Catherine of Alexandria, Virgin and Martyr (Opt Mem) – 25 November:

St Catherine of Alexandria was a fourth century martyr. Later tradition makes her a well-born maiden of Alexandria (Egypt) who was martyred after refusing to worship pagan gods. During her interrogation, she ably defended the faith in a debate with the city's leading philosophers. According to legen, her body was taken by angels to Mount Sinai, where a monastery was built in her honour.

St Andrew, Apostle (Feast) – 30 November: (Transferred to 1 December:

St Andrew (first century) was born at Bethsaida and worked as a fisherman. He is called the Protokletos or 'first called', for he was originally a disciple of St John the Baptist before following Christ and bringing with him his brother, St Peter. After Pentecost he zealously preached the Gospel and was crucified at Patras (Greece) He is the Patron of Scotland, where his relics were formerly venerated at St Andrews.

Prayer to St Michael:

'St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.'
