St Wulstan, Bishop (Opt Mem) – 19 January:

St Wulfstan or Wulstan (1008-1095) became a Benedictine monk at Worcester and, after serving as Precentor and Prior, was appointed Bishop in 1062. He was the only Englishman to retain his see after the Norman Conquest. His wise and benevolent rule lasted thirty-two years, during which he rebuilt his cathedral, reformed the diocese and tried to stop the slave-trade at Bristol. English slaves were sold to Norse traders in Ireland until the twelfth century.

St Fabian, Pope and Martyr (Opt Mem) – 20 January:

St Fabian (+ 250) was elected Bishop of Rome in 236, despite not being in Holy Orders. He divided Rome into seven diaconates for the purpose of extending aid to the poor and was finally martyred under the Emperor Decius. St Cyprian called him an 'incomptable man.'

St Agnes, Virgin and Martyr (Memorial) – 21 January:

St Agnes (+ c.304) came from a noble Roman family. According to a fifth century Life, she was about thirteen years old when she suffered martyrdom by being stabbed in the throat, after refusing to be married to a pagan. She was buried on the Via Nomentana and her name is included in the Roman Canon. She is often shown with a lamb, a symbol of her purity and also a play on her name (which in Greek means 'chaste') and the Latin word agnus (meaning 'lamb').

St Vincent, Deacon and Martyr (Opt Mem) – 22 January:

St Vincent (+ 304) was a deacon of the Church in Saragossa, Spain. He was brutally tortured and martyred at Valencia in the persecution under Diocletian. His cult grew quickly and both St Augustine and St Leo preached sermons in his honour. He is the proto-martyr of Spain.

St Francis de Sales, Bishop and Doctor of the Church –**24 January:**

St Francis de Sales (1567-1622) was born in Thorens, Savoy (France) and trained as a lawyer before being ordained. He became Bishop of Geneva in 1602 and did much to combat Calvinism. He also founded the Order of the Visitation, with St Jane Frances de Chantal, and produced popular spiritual works such as Introduction to the Devout Life. His flock called him 'the Gentle Christ of Geneva'. Pius XI declared St Francis patron of journalists and writers in 1923.

The conversion of St Paul the Apostle (Feast) – 25 January:

This Feast commemorates the conversion of Saul of Tarsus while he was on his way to Damascus to persecute Christians. He was blinded by a light and thrown from his horse to the ground, hearing the words, 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?' As Pope Benedict XVI wrote, 'the Risen One spoke to Paul, called him to the apostolate and made him a true Apostle, a witness of the Resurrection, with the specific task of proclaiming the Gospel to the Gentiles, to the Graeco-Roman world.'
