**All Saints of Scotland (Feast) – 16 June:**

This celebration gives an opportunity to celebrate the many saints, whether well-known or largely forgotten, associated with Scotland: Irish missionaries, holy monks and nuns and zealous pastors; those who shed their blood for the Faith, and men and women who have built up God's Kingdom over the centuries.

**St Richard of Chichester, Bishop (Opt Mem) – 16 June:**

St Richard of Chichester (1197-1253) was born at Droitwich and educated at Oxford, Paris and Bologna. For a period he was Chancellor of Oxford University and legal adviser to the Archbishop of Canterbury, before being appointed bishop of Chichester in 1244. He lived simply and was generous to the poor. He died at Dover while preaching the crusade.

**St Romuald, Annot (Opt Mem) – 19 June:**

St Romuald (c.950-1027) was born at Ravenna (Italy) of a noble family and joined the Cluniac monastery of San Miniato. He founded houses at Fonte Avellana and Camaldoli, which became the mother house of an Order of hermit monks following the Rule of St Benedict. He died in 1027 after a life of prayer and rigorous penance.

**St Alban, Martyr (Opt Mem) – 20 June:**

St Alban (+ c.209, or c.254) was a citizen of Verulamium (now St Albans, Hertfordshire) who converted to Christianity, it is said after sheltering a fugitive priest. He was beheaded on Holmhurst Hill, where an abbey was later built. St Alban is the Protomartyr of England.

**Ss Alban, Julius and Aaron, Protomartyrs of Britain (Opt Mem in Wales) – 20 June:**

Ss Julius and Aaron (+ c.305) suffered at Caerleon-upon-Usk, possibly under Diocletian. These martyrs are a witness to the early existence of the faith in England and Wales.

**St Aloysius Gonzaga, Religious (Memorial) – 21 June:**

St Aloysius Gonzaga (1568-1591) belonged to one of the great Italian noble families and served as a page at several princely courts. At the age of eighteen he embraced a life of poverty and obedience by joining the Society of Jesus. He showed great piety and died as a result of his heroic nursing of the plague stricken in 1591. He has been declared protector of students and patron of Christian youth.
